Pet pee, poop, hair, skin flakes and saliva can trigger an asthma attack. These are carried in the air and can be inhaled into your lungs.

Tiny dust on a pet can get on your clothing, hands, skin and eyes from contact with pets.



Lessen allergy symptoms from pets

- Know that cats cause the most allergy symptoms.
- Keep pets out of sleeping areas or keep them to one area of the home, such as outdoors, or the basement.
- Keep pets away from furniture such as a chair or couch with stuffing, cushions, fabric and other materials.
- Keep pets away from carpets, heavy drapes, and stuffed toys.
- If needed, you could find the pet a new home.
