

Using Your Nebulizer

Follow these steps to use your nebulizer correctly

- **1.** Connect nebulizer tubing to nebulizer machine.
- Fill the nebulizer cup with the liquid nebulizer medication (solution).
 Close and connect the nebulizer cup with the mouthpiece or mask.
- **3.** Connect nebulizer cup to the other end of the nebulizer tubing.
- **4.** Place the mouthpiece in your mouth or secure mask over the nose and mouth of child.
- Turn machine on to start the treatment. The treatment often takes 10 to 15 minutes.
- Instruct child to breathe through their mouth until all the medicine is used. Small children often do better if they wear a mask.
- 7. Tap the nebulizer cup when it starts to make a sputtering noise. This often happens near the end of the 10 to 15 minutes. Tapping the cup makes sure all the medication is used.

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Cleaning your nebulizer

After Each Use:

- Disconnect your nebulizer (t-piece or mask) from the tubing and take it apart.
- 2. Rinse the nebulizer cup with warm water.
- **3.** Shake off the extra water and let air dry.

At Least One Time a Week: Soak all the parts (but not the tubing) in warm water with a tablespoon of white vinegar. Let the parts air dry on clean paper towels. Put them back together and keep in a dry, cool place.

- Never put the tubing in water. Water damages the tubing. Get new tubing if water gets inside.
- **Reusable nebulizer cups** need to be thrown away every 6 months.
- **Disposable nebulizer cups** need to be thrown away every 2 weeks.

Do not run out of medication

- Keep a watch on the number of doses left in your medication.
- When you have used about half of the doses, call to get a refill.
